Our previous exploits mean that our youngsters have a lot to live up to if they are to repeat our successes at the National Sportshall Finals. However, at this stage lets wish all the contestants enjoyable competition because we need them to enjoy our sport so that they are encouraged to stay with us and maybe become the champions of the future. One athlete who is fulfilling her promise is Long Jumper Jade Johnson of Herne Hill Harriers. I doubt that in her wildest dreams before this season that she would have anticipated coming second in both the Commonwealth Games and the European Championships and then being chosen for the European Select team. From a county perspective there is still one target left for her to achieve - the County record of 6.75m set by Joyce Oladapo in 1985. The fact that Jade has achieved such international success without yet beating Joyce's record is a tribute to how fine a performance it was.

This issue contains details of our athletes' performances at the Commonwealth Games and European Championships plus all the medalists in the county championships held over the past three months. It shows that the county association is playing its part in providing competition at the grass roots level. Our role complements that of the clubs as it has done for over 80 years. Let us hope that we are not forgotten when the Government's millions are being allocated for the development of grass roots athletics.

This excludes Children in Athletics if taken as the event module. Course cost: £100.

BOOK REVIEW

HERNE HILL HARRIERS - INTO THE MILLENNIUM reviewed by Pete Mulholland.

ALMOST thirty years in the making, this hardback history of Herne Hill Harriers was a labour of love by it's compiler Kevin Kelly who has set a standard that future club historians will find a hard act to follow. Within it's 638 pages with some 800 photos the volume is thicker than an old London telephone directory and with probably more information. It tells of the club's early days when a group of boys met in a tuck shop at 99 Milkwood Road, SE24 prior to the founding of the club in 1889 at the time of the original 'running boom'. For ease of reference the volume is divided into five chapters with a comprehensive review of each era followed by detailed performances of the Harriers in both major and minor competitions in the period covered.

Competing and training in the then open spaces of south London, the club had to wait until the turn of the century before tasting real success when in 1902 Fred Appleby startled the athletic world by defeating the 'unbeatable' Alfred Shrubb. More fame was soon to follow as both Joe Deakin and David Jacobs won Olympic gold while the trio of Appleby, Harry Green and Edgar Lloyd all set world records and for the 1912 Olympics no less then ten Herne Hill Harriers were selected for Great Britain. One problem encountered in the latter years of the 19th century was that clubs affiliated to the Southern Counties Cross-Country Association were banned from road running within a four mile radius of Charing Cross. Not much chance of a London Marathon in those days then!

Since those heady days the club has enjoyed success at various levels with some 97 members having gained international selection, among them being long jumper John Howell, first Briton over 25ft (7.62m), former UK 10,000m record holder Don Taylor and the club's most capped athlete, high hurdler Laurie Taitt. One who could have proved Britain's greatest ever miler was Denis Pell, second only to Sydney Wooderson in the late 1930s but who sadly was killed in action during the Second World War.

From its early days the club provided many an official in the higher echelons of athletic administration the supreme honour going to the late Ron Goodman who was elected as the President of the AAA in 1984. Admitted to membership in 1976 the women were soon to make their mark culminating in the recent European and Commonwealth silvers obtained by Jade Johnson - who joined the club as a 12-year-old - which coincides with the current term of office for the club's first ever female President, Clare Pauzers. Not sure what those boys of 1889 would have made of the recent appearance of Jade Johnson in a 'lads' mag' but one thing is for certain: they would have been proud that she is a Herne Hill Harrier.

All athletic devotees should beg, steal or borrow to obtain a copy of this publication, which is a social as well as an athletic document, as the enthusiasm for the club scene, which accounts for some 99% of athletic followers in this country, permeates from the pages. The behind the scenes efforts of club organisation, far removed from 'the corridors of power', are well documented and follow the pattern of problems faced by clubs the length and breadth of the country.

Active Sport Talent Camp

The London development team are pleased to report the success of the first ever Active Sports Talent camp that took place on Monday 8th and Tuesday the 9th July at Crystal Palace.

Athletics, (one of the seven sports at the Talent Camp) selected 60 young people between the ages of 14 and 16 from across the whole London region, from various athletic disciplines. The London development team were fortunate enough to get the services of some top coaches, which included Mike McFarlane OBE (top sprinter himself as well as coach to Dwain Chambers), Tony Jarrett, Julian Golding and Jonathan Barbour.

The children worked for two days with their event coaches and also attended workshops on nutrition and injury and prevention.

As a special surprise the children were able to have a question & answer session with Jonathan Barbour the Under 23 European 100m Champion and also see his training partner Dwain Chambers doing a very, very fast training session! The camp was a great success and a big thank you to all coaches and team managers who made the two days the success that they were.

5th London Athletics Forum - "Big Money - Small Money?"

Following up from the successful first London Athletics Forum back in 2001, this fifth LAF revisited the subject of making grant applications to *Awards for All* and the *London Marathon Trust*.

Regional Development Co-ordinator Jason Fergus started the evening off with an outline of the Awards for All programme in London. The application form has changed very recently and he guided those present through the new changes. Peter Snell then went on to explain how he with his club, Victoria Park Harriers & Tower Hamlets AC, has been successful with the Awards for All programme.

Peter also importantly highlighted how clubs need to prove that they are capable of spending a public grant and doing so in a purposeful way. He said 'trust' needed to be built up by clubs when it comes to the application, and the spending of, grants.

The second half of the evening was devoted to the London Marathon Trust. *RDC* David Reader highlighted that since last years LAF, the amount of money the Trust donated to athletic projects more than doubled to £254,000. This was the most ever and David was keen to see this trend continue, urging those present to make applications this year. *Havering Mayesbrook AC* Chairman, Doug Tierney, then addressed the audience, explaining how his club had gained £75,000 from the Trust last year. He went on to explain how the application form for the Trust is one of the easiest you are likely to come across.

Awards for All winners

Congratulations go to the three recipients of Awards for All money at the last round of awards. Hercules Wimbledon were awarded £4400, Langdon Park School were awarded £5000 for Sportshall athletics equipment and the Uxbridge & District Primary Schools Sports Association were also awarded £4600 for athletics equipment.

Overall, athletics lies 6th in terms of total awards. Sports that lie above us are basketball, table tennis, cricket and guess who sits at the top? Yes it's football!

Jade Johnson won the SILVER medal in the Womens Long Jump.

Shelley Newman won the BRONZE medal in the Womens Discus.

Emeka Udechuku was 6th in the Mens Discus and 9th in the Mens Shot.

John Heanley was 8th in the Decathlon.

Tracey Bloomfield was 10th in the Womens Pole Vault.

Richard Aspden was 11th in the Mens High Jump.

Jonathan McCallum was 11th in the Mens 1500m representing Scotland.

Chris Lambert placed 6th in the Mens 200 Metres semi-final.

Anthony Soalla-Bell broke Sierra Leone National Records in both the Shot and Discus.

Natasha Danvers fell at the final hurdle when in with a medal chance in the Womens 400M Hurdles.

Mark Awanah fouled out in the Mens Long Jump qualifying.

Mark Easton was disqualified in the Mens 50K Walk.

European Athletics Championships - Munich, 6 - 11 August 2002

Jade Johnson (HHH) excels to win Silver medal in Long Jump.

Jade was the leading qualifier - she was the only competitor to achieve the qualifying distance of 6.60m - with her first attempt of 6.60m (-0.5). In the final she faced local favourite and former world-record holder Heike Drechsler and the 2002 leading European with a season's best of 7.42m Tatyana Kotova of Russia. Jade's series of (6.66/-0.5; 6.72/+1.2; x; 6.52/-1.1; 6.73/+1.1; 6.58/0.0) gave her a PB of 6.73 (previously 6.69) and second place behind Kotova and marginally ahead of Tunde Vaszi of Hungary who also cleared 6.73 in the fifth round but whose next best jump was 6.57.

Natasha Danvers (Shaftesbury Barnet) finishes 7th in 400 Metres Hurdles Final.

Natasha qualified for the final as the second fastest of those who did not qualify by finishing in the first two places in the three heats by finishing fourth (56.55) in the first heat which was won by the eventual champion Ionela Tirlea of Romania. In the final Natasha was drawn in lane 8 - a time close to her season's best of 55.58 would have seen her medal but she was unable to reproduce that form and clocked 56.93 for seventh place.

NOSTALGIA

On 1 September 1962, Stephen Peter Badgery of Mitcham AC set the oldest Surrey County record on the books. He covered four laps of the 440 yards cinder track at Carshalton (now Sutton Arena) in 4:28.4, an Under 15 record that still stands forty years later. At the time, it was also hailed as an UK age best.

Back then, the British Prime Minister was Harold Macmillan, and John Fitzgerald Kennedy was President of the USA, about to face the Cuban missile crisis the following month. An obscure Liverpool band called the Beatles had been performing in Hamburg, Germany, and were soon to be signed up to the big time by the Parlophone record label. Cliff Richard, (aged 22 on 14 October 1962), was starring in the sanitised hit movie 'Summer Holiday', and Del Shannon's song 'Runaway' was racing up the pop charts to no. 1. There were no all-weather tracks anywhere, and nobody had ever seen a mobile telephone.

The British Milers' Club was not yet in existence, and a young policeman named Andy Norman was the best Junior (U20) in the Metropolitan Police AC at both 440 and 880 yards with times of 50.1 and 1:55.7. In those days, Mr Norman was slim and fit, and had yet to meet Ms. Fatima Whitbread, who was just one year old. Britain's future great milers were aged six (Steve Ovett), five (Seb Coe), and almost two (Steve Cram).

Earlier that year, New Zealander Peter Snell had broken his own world record for the mile with 3:54.1 (from 3:54.4) and went on to win both the 880yards and mile titles at the Empire/Commonwealth Games in Perth, Western Australia. The Surrey mile champion was Badgery's clubmate Tony Harris, who ran 4:07.2 at Motspur Park in May, prior to taking the inter-counties title at White City in West London. Both stadiums no longer exist. Harris went on to represent Great Britain at the European Championships over 800m in Belgrade, and Wales at 880 yards and mile at the Commonwealth Games in Perth.

Young Badgery was way ahead of his time. To be fair, his record has survived over the years partly because the Under 15 age group rarely contest races over one mile (1,609 metres). And when Nick Green of Mitcham & Sutton AC won the "Southern" Boys 1500m title in 4:07.56 at Crystal Palace on 20 July 1986, his time was certainly worth around 4:27.0 for the mile. Green certainly smashed the Surrey U15 Boys 1500m record, but never raced the additional 109 metres.

Badgery never retired, boasting personal best marks of 1:52.6 for 880 yards all the way up to 2:15:44 for the marathon during his adult track career. Now a member of Hercules Wimbledon AC, he is still active as an Over 50 Veteran, and has run in every London Marathon since the event's inception in 1981.

There was no special celebration of this local county landmark record. But some of us remembered, and raised a quiet glass to Steve Badgery's effort at Carshalton forty years after the event.

Michael Robertson Maynard, Herne Hill Harriers greatest ever cross-country runner and a key member during their 1950s heydays, has died in Hove, Sussex at the age of 71. Third in the 'National' at Peterborough in 1959 after placing 8th in 1954, 5th in 1955 and 6th in 1958, such was the depth of competition in those days Mike was never to win county or

It was his performance in that 1954 race that saw Mike gain selection for England, the clubs' first international over the country since Olympic gold medallist Joe Deakin in 1908.

Mike also won international honours on the track when finishing a close second for England against Belgium at the White City on September 29, 1954, a year he was Surrey County 3-mile champion.

It was on the road, however, that Mike had one of his most enjoyable memories when running the seventh stage in the Herne Hill Harriers' winning team in the 'Southern' London to Brighton relay, also in 1954.

On the periphery of the Boxhill outfit during their days of success at area, county and league levels, Barry was nonetheless a vital cog in the club. Robin Batchelor, club secretary and coach to Barry, said, "Such was the depth of our squad in those days Barry couldn't quite make the team but he more than made up for it with his enthusiasm and his knack of motivating the lads."

Barry also competed for Hercules Wimbledon AC in their British League days and as well as his involvement at club level, he also spent many hours assisting the Flora London Marathon organisers.

Among the hundreds of mourners were Dave Bedford and all of his marathon team plus there was a huge presence from the London Fire Brigade for who Barry was a member of the blue watch at their Clapham station.

Throughout the funeral messages were read out and speeches made that spoke glowingly of Barry's popularity, humour and as someone who enjoyed life to the full. As well as being missed in the athletic world he will also be missed at Selhurst Park, the home of his beloved Crystal Palace Football Club, his season ticket arriving just days before his untimely death.
