URGENT MATTERS

At the forthcoming AGM of the AAA of England it is expected that clubs will be asked to vote on a proposal to, in effect, replace AAAoE by England Athletics. This is the consequence of the deliberations following the publication of the "Foster" Report. The consequences of the vote, whichever way it goes, are likely to be fundamental for the future development of our sport. The Surrey County Athletic Association considers it to be very important that all clubs express a view by voting at the AGM. Each affiliated club has at least one vote and if a club representative is unable to attend then the club can submit a proxy.

It is difficult to know the precise consequences of the proposed structure that would underlie England Athletics with its hubs/regions taking over many of the functions of the territories. There are differences of opinion as to the intended roles of county associations - some believe that the new structure means that counties will go the way of the territories whilst others see the counties continuing as before (if they choose). We in Surrey (ie sporting Surrey as opposed to political Surrey) will be affected by the proposed structure as we are likely to be split across two hubs/regions and therefore will have two separate bodies administering our activities as opposed, at present, to a single body - the SEAA. We have managed over recent years to work with RDC's who are based in separate regions but now the situation is different because the proposals now impact upon on the competitive structure.

We are told that the England Athletics Working Group has produced detailed plans. There will be a series of meetings in early February at which members of the project team will discuss their proposals. The meetings which are being held near to Surrey are:

Monday, 7 February at Thames Valley Athletic Centre, Eton (7.00 for 7.30pm)

Tuesday, 8 February at Sport England, Bloomsbury (7.00 for 7.30pm)

Wednesday, 9 February at Broadfields Stadium, Crawley (7.00 for 7.30pm)

All Surrey clubs are urged to attend one of the above. Included with this copy of SCAN are copies of the paper produced by the Project Team in December 2004 and a copy of a recent letter sent by the Association seeking clarification of various matters. When a response is received to our letter it will be forwarded to club secretaries. In this way we are attempting to provide the clubs with as much information as possible to assist them in making their vote. Also included is UKA's response to the consultation on the competitive structure.

On the centre pages within SCAN you will find items from Our President, Martin Goodway and the RDC for the South East Region, Elspeth Turner.

SURREY ATHLETES AT INTERNATIONAL MEETINGS (November 2004 - January 2005)

EUROPEAN CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS - HERINGS DORF, GERMANY - 12 DECEMBER.

Natalie HARVEY (South London Harriers) finished 13th in the Senior Women's race at the Spar European Cross Country Championships. She was the third Briton in the team which finished second.

PETER HARDING 1921 - 2004

Peter Harding, a founder member of Walton Athletic Club in 1942, died in St Peter's Hospital, Chertsey, Surrey, on November 18 at the age of 83. He had been suffering from cancer.

Harding began his running with a group of friends on the track at Stompond Lane, Walton, which had been completed just before the outbreak of the Second World War. While London was subject to intensive bombing, Walton-on-Thames was, in comparison relatively unaffected and while many tracks were taken over by the military or mothballed, the one at Stompond Lane was open and available.

Encouraged by a local council official, Harding and four friends formed Walton Athletic Club in 1942 and he was founder secretary from then until 1985. His running days were cruelly ended when he was struck down by polio while on his honeymoon but he never lost his enthusiasm for athletics or his club and was a familiar sight at Stompond Lane with a walking stick.

The new club thrived and in the 1950's boasted some of the top athletes in the country including former world 5000m record-holder Chris Chataway, former UK 1500m record-holder Bill Nankeville, four times AAA mile champion in 1948, 1949, 1950 and 1952, 400m international Malcolm Yardley, pole vault international Bert Hopkins, former UK triple jump record-holder Ken Wilmshurst, Irish cross country international Terry Keegan, discus international Mark Pharoh, steeplechase international Tony Llewellyn and Welsh international Bob Roath.

Harding was also closely associated with the Road Runners Club whose founder Ernest Neville lived nearby. Stompond Lane was the venue for a host of ultra-distance track races, in which top runners like Gordon Pirie, Joe Lancaster, Arthur Keily, Mel Batty, Gerry North, Jim Alder and Jim Hogan took part in the 1950's, 1960's and 1970's.

Harding also launched the annual Hewitt-Jones road relay immediately after the war named after two Walton runners who were killed on active service. The relay continued until a few years ago.

"He was really Walton Athletic Club and helped get the club on its feet and keep it going," said Bruce Judd, who joined Walton in 1949. "It was very sad the way he left the club and after 1985 he never really returned although he did occasionally walk round the track to see what was going on."
